

Animal Faeces Everyone involved in the session.		 Leader in charge to survey the activity area before starting, remove and dispose of animal faeces. Any animal faeces identified while participating in the activity, pause activity and Leader in charge to remove and dispose of animal faeces. 		
Weather Conditions & Environment	Everyone involved in the session.	 Bring clothing and equipment appropriate to the weather conditions. In event of inclement weather, the activity instructor may cancel or postpone the activity, in the meanwhile Leader in charge to find a point of safety. In hot weather ensure adequate hydration and self-administration of sun protection. Use torches if dark. Wear close toed footwear (i.e. no sandals/ flip flops, etc) Turn on activity flood lighting as appropriate
